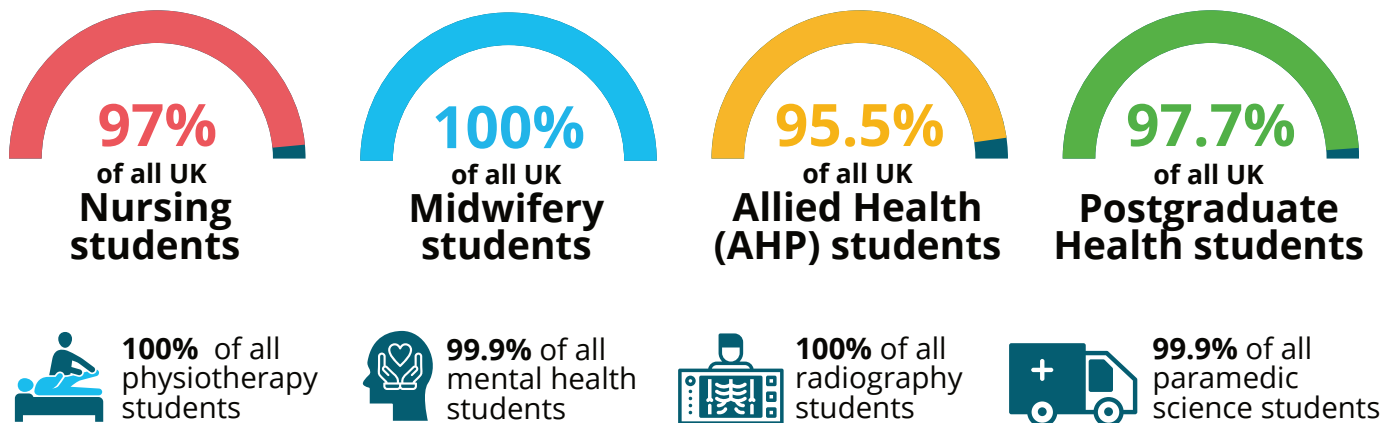


Our member universities deliver the future healthcare workforce of the NHS, charitable and private sectors.
